The University Education in Sri Lanka has experienced a significant growth since 1978 after the present Universities Act was promulgated. The number of universities has increased from 6 to 15 during 1978 and 2008 with equally a



significant number of affiliated campuses and postgraduate institutions. The growth during the past two years (2006-2007) is the most noteworthy in terms of student enrollment and establishments of new institutions.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) is the main hub of the university system. The task of the UGC is not merely to distribute financial grants of the Government to various universities or monitor the activities and standards of them in addition to selecting students each year for university admissions. The UGC should provide leadership to the university system in order that the universities and the academics contribute positively and substantially to the country's development through research, publication, training and policy advice.

It is in the above backdrop that information sharing, institutional cooperation, joint ventures and networking between these universities and the UGC are important and crucial. There are various ways and means of achieving the objectives of cooperation or networking and a regular and an effective newsletter is one such mechanism.

PROMOTING UGC - STAKEHOLDER INTERACTION

he University Grants Commission is the Apex body of the University system and of higher education in Sri Lanka. Higher education is the most crucial area that needs to be developed and promoted in strengthening the human resources of a country. For this purpose the Ministry of Higher Education together with the Higher Education Institutes, the students, academics, the nonacademic staff and the general public have to play an effective role as its stakeholders. In addition, the Ministries of Education, Policy Planning, Finance and Vocational Training are expected to work jointly in collaboration with the UGC in this endeavour. However, very often at any Institution the tasks and activities carried out are not easily known to the public. For that matter, even the sister departments or the other units of a same organization is not aware of the activities carried out by one unit. Thus, it is mandatory that a viable and effective system of communication should be developed to disseminate information pertaining to the activities of a unit. This is the basis on which the UGC has launched an official News Letter

titled 'UGC Newsletter' to be published every four months to serve as a medium to educate all stakeholders on its activities.

Today you are reading its first issue with introductory messages from the Honourable Minister of Higher Education and Chairma/ UGC. The contents of this first issue are mainly focused on statistics related to Higher Education and some of the key events and activities carried out by the UGC in the recent past. In the future, we are expecting the wider participation of the stakeholders by responding to the contents published in this four monthly newsletter in the form of feedback and interaction. We believe that facilitating such a dialogue would certainly help in the build up of confidence amongst all concerned on the overall functions of the University Grants Commission and the University system. Furthermore, this newsletter is expected to play the crucial role of a messenger to encourage and promote a dialogue between the UGC and all the stakeholders. We wish that in future this publication would serve as a link document to bridge the gap between the academic institutes, UGC and the General Public at large.

New Corporate Plan - 2008 - 2010

The University Grants Commission has finalized its Corporate Plan for the period 2008-10. This Corporate plan was prepared with the full participation of all the officials of the Commission over a period of five months. One of the key features is the inclusion in the action plan the activities that could be realistically carried out within the intended period. Most importantly, the Commission did not incur any expenditure in preparing the corporate plan as it was done entirely by the members of the Commission and the executive staff.

The corporate plan has been prepared according to the guidelines given by the Auditor Generals Department. Accordingly, the contents include, Vision, Mission, the resources available, the

performance report for the previous three years, Organagram of the Institute, SWOT analysis, goals, objectives and strategies including action plan with budget together with time frame identifying the responsible units or officers. The whole corporate plan is structured on five goals. The fifth goal focuses on the role of the UGC in achieving goals 1 to 4 which addresses issues related to access; equity, quality & relevance; scholarship, research & service and accountability, financial viability & efficient management. It is expected to prepare the final document before the end of March, 2008 to be distributed to all the higher educational institutions in order to prepare their plans to suit the UGC corporate plan.

Admission to Universities in Sri Lanka

Amission of students to 14 National Universities and four Institutes set up under the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 is being done by the University Grants Commission. Admission of students to courses offered by the Open University of Sri Lanka, Institute of Human Resource Advancement, Institute of Technology, University of Moratuwa is handled by the respective Universities/Institutes on the basis of an admission policy laid down from time to time by the UGC with the

concurrence of the Government.

- (a) Admission to Arts based courses will be made on an all island merit basis.
- (b) Admission to all courses other than Arts based courses will be made on dual criteria, namely, all island merit and merit on district basis.
- (c) Up to 40% of the available places will be filled on all island merit basis and up to 55% of the available places in each course of study will be allocated to the 25 administrative districts on the ratio of the population of the district concerned to the total population of the country.
- (d) A special allocation up to 5% of the

available places in each course of study will be allocated to the 16 educationally disadvantaged districts on the ratio of the population of each such district to total population of the 16 districts.

2. Admission of students for 2006/2007

Academic Year. - A total of 17630 students were selected for 62 courses of study for the 2006/2007

Academic year based on the results of the G.C.E.(A/L) examination held in May, 2006. The number of students selected to the four main courses of studies, i.e. Medicine, Engineering, Management and Arts from each district on merit basis and district basis are given the in - Table-1

From the table it could be noted that the most number of students selected under the merit quota for the courses study in Medicine, Engineering and Management are from the Colombo district. However, the most number of students selected to the courses of study in Arts are from the Kurunegala district.

3. Admission of Students for the 2007/2008
Academic Year. - It is proposed to admit 19650
students for 74 courses of study for 2007/2008
academic year based on the results of the G.C.E. (A/L)
examination held in August 2007. Accordingly there is
an increase of 2020 students compared to the student
intake for the last academic year.

Year 2007 of the UGC - FlashBack

Third meeting of the Heads of University Grants Commissions /Equivalent Bodies of the SAARC Region - The Heads of UGCs and Equivalent Bodies of the SAARC region was formed in 2002. Accordingly the first meeting was held in Dhaka, Bangladesh and the second was held in Islamabad, Pakistan in 2003 and 2004 respectively. Third meeting was held in Sri Lanka during 26th to 27th January, 2007. At the meeting the major issues related to the Sri Lankan education sector were identified and inter-country cooperation in higher education was addressed.

Mobilising the University System for Deyata-Kirula Exhibition 2006 - The Presidential Secretariat has organized a national exhibition portraying the developments in the country especially projecting the future, in all sectors. The University System was adequately represented at this exhibition titled as 'Deyata Kirula'. Within a short period of time most of the Universities were mobilised to take part in this exhibition.

Addressing of Special problems encountered on University Admissions for 2006 - The University admissions for 2006 were seriously constrained by the discrepancies and the said incorrectness in marking

the GCE A/L Chemistry paper by the Examinations Department. The UGC was compelled to review its regular procedures adopted for admissions, since some students who were deemed to have been eligible for admission found that assurance was not valid on the basis of re-corrected results released subsequently. After having discussions with Universities, UGC was able to make arrangements to intake 1000 extra students in science based courses, including 199 for Medicine and 126 for Engineering.

Creation of a New Medical Faculty - The UGC was faced with the challenge of finding a place for the medical course for 140 students. Inaddition 38 Muslim students who were assigned to the newly established Health Science Faculty of the Eastern University to follow the Medical Course also had to be provided suitable placements within the other medical schools. With the directions of HE the President the UGC established a new Medical Faculty at the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka to provide facilities for the above intake.

Establishment of a New Faculty of Allied Health Sciences 2006 - In the year 2003, the Medical Faculties were requested to introduce new

programmes in order to increase the student intake. To introduce new courses in Health Sciences, suitable curricular has to be prepared and the necessary funding for capacity building should be identified. The Peradeniya University had prematurely undertaken a project that needs multi-sectoral participation and commitment. However, with the enrolment of students identified to follow health sciences to the University an acute crisis was precipitated due to the refusal of the Medical Faculty to accommodate the additional students.

Establishment of New Departments to meet the current needs in Agriculture Faculties - Agricultural studies needs special attention as it is one of the prime areas that could contribute for the national development. There are several areas in the field of Agriculture that need to be strengthened to meet challenges faced by the Agricultural sector. In view of the above special needs the Faculties of Agriculture had identified the disciplines that should be developed

Student Crisis at the Gampaha Wickramarachchi Ayurveda Institute 2006 - The Commission was faced with a long drawn problem of finding suitable proposals to reduce the tension that has been built up within this institution over the past few years. The problems related to this institution was separately dealt with, specially assisting them on certain urgent needs, thereby a smooth running of the undergraduate studies.

Increasing Human Resources in the University System 2006 - There has not been any new recruitment for the administrative positions since 2004, especially at the Assistant Registrar level. There was an urgent need to fill the existing vacancies to facilitate the smooth functioning of the Universities. The recruitment process was expedited to increase the human resources within the University System during the last year.

Implementation of the new Salary structure proposed by the National Salaries and Cadre Commission - The UGC has to prepare within a short period of time, the restructured scheme with almost caution to honour the governments pledge.

Problems encountered in the Universities in the North and East - Amidst the current problems experienced within the North and East regions of the country, the Universities in these regions faced special problems. Some of these were lack of staff, complaints of insecurity by the students enrolled from other parts of the country, especially belonging to the Sinhala and Muslim communities are the major issues. A series of activities

were developed to continue monitoring, reporting and reviewing process to support and sustain the activities of these Universities.

The Establishment of a Research Promotion Cell at the UGC for University Industry Community Interaction - One of the primary objectives of the Universities is to conduct research and develop new knowledge especially on community-industry based problems,

Although a special unit was set up within the UGC in 2005 to address issues related to research, there has not been any further development except for a workshop conducted in early 2006. Thus during the year 2007 certain activities related to research promotion were streamlined and enhanced motivating the academic staff to carry out research.

Revival of the International Co-operation Division of the UGC - The problems related to the lack of opportunities to undertake post-graduate studies are numerous. As a consequence there is a significant decline in the available qualified staff at senior lecturer levels, especially in the fields of Humanities, Social Sciences and Management studies. The UGC has decided in principle to establish with the UGC in India and initiate a Scholarship scheme for probationary/Senior Lecturers in the fields of Humanities, Social Sciences and Management studies.

Other major activities undertaken during the year 2007

- 1. Contribution to the establishment of the South Asian University in New Delhi, India.
- 2. Exploring the possibilities of establishing inkages with major Universities in the SAARC region
- Re-organization of the project for the construction of the Maldives Library.
- 4. Preparation of a scheme to increase the intake of students up to 25,000 per year by 2010.
- 5. Organizing staff development programmes for executive staff and junior lecturers
- 6. Revisit the Corporate plan of the UGC and the Universities
- 7. Visiting some of the HEIs on fact finding exercise
- 8. Resolving some of the major internal problems of the HEIs
