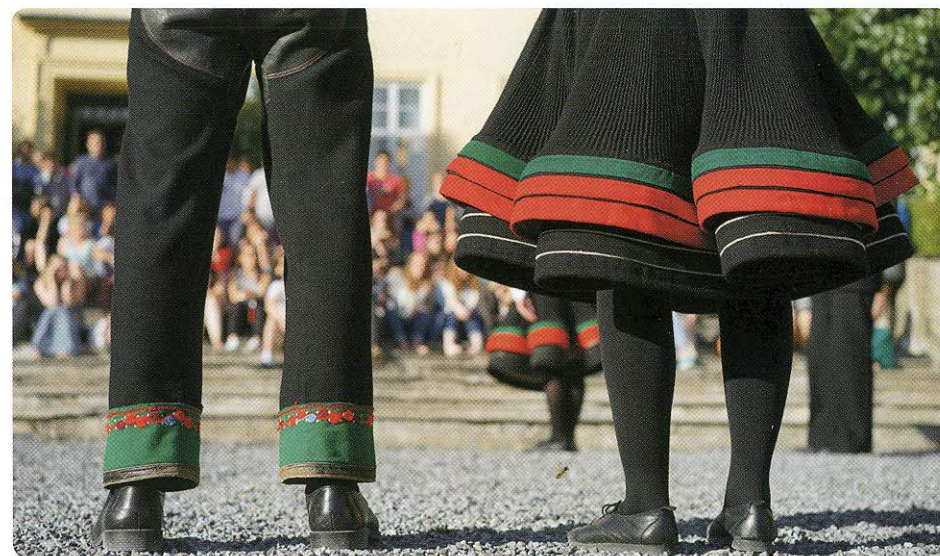
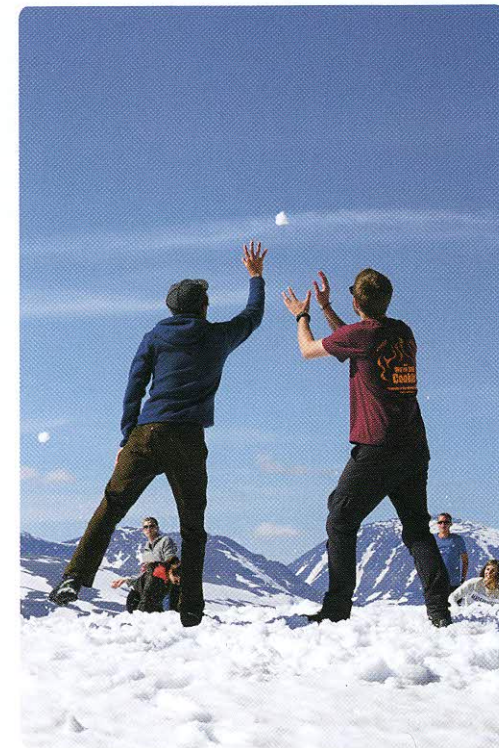


Why Norway?

Breathtaking scenery, fascinating history and culture, strong economy, well-functioning welfare state – an interesting country to explore, to experience and use as a springboard for engaging and critical studies of a wide array of cultural and social issues.

Why the International Summer School (ISS)

An ideal setting for an exploration of Norwegian and international issues. A center for learning aimed at developing and conveying knowledge, and at promoting understanding between people.



Courses

- Instruction is provided in various formats: lectures, classroom sessions, student presentations, group exercises and discussions.
- Emphasis on interactive teaching methods and comparative approach to the subjects.
- Field visits are an integral part of ISS courses.
- All courses last for six weeks, except for the three-week course Nynorsk.
- Attendance is obligatory and required in order to sit for examinations.
- Students are expected to complete coursework and sit for final examinations.
- Norwegian Life and Society is available as an additional course for all ISS students.

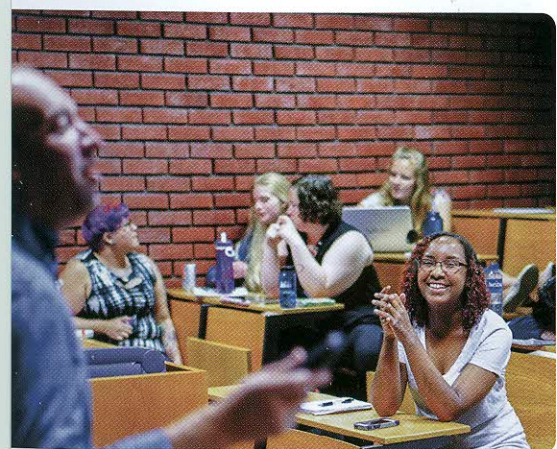

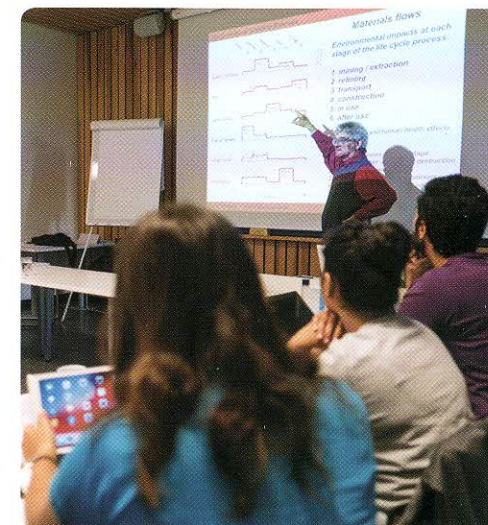

Admission

- Admission to Bachelor's level courses requires the completion of studies equivalent to the Norwegian secondary school. For applicants from outside of Europe, one year of completed university studies is often required.
- Master's courses have additional requirements, such as a Bachelor's degree in a relevant field and preferably also some previous work experience.
- English language proficiency is a requirement for all applicants, for many applicants a recognized English language test is required.
- Course schedule subject to change.
- Courses offered subject to sufficient enrollment.

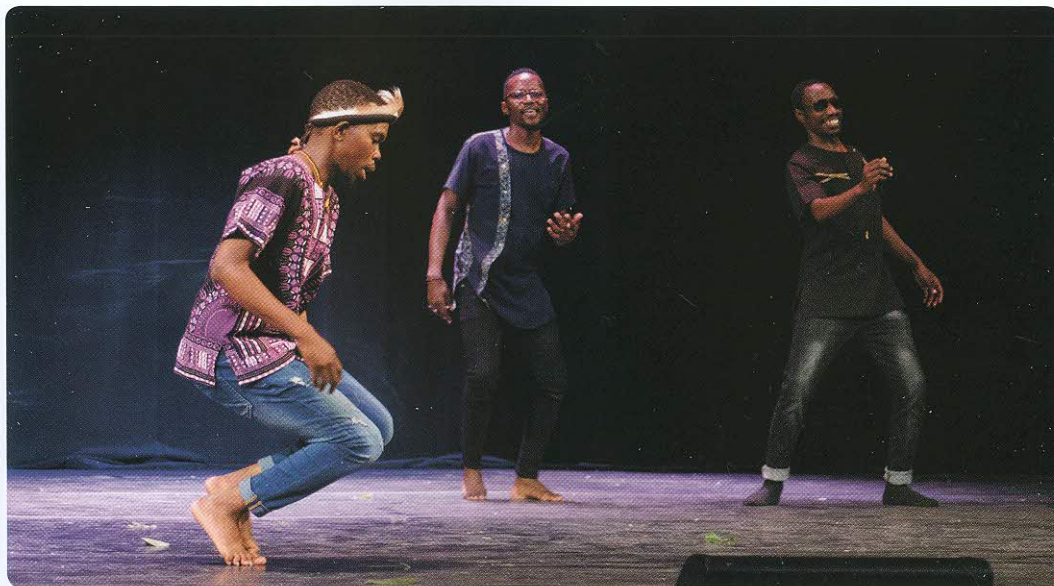
Beyond the Classroom

The ISS offers a rich variety of cultural and social activities and events, including:

Fees

The basic fee includes extracurricular activities and one weekend excursion. Undergraduate participants may take more than one course for the same basic fee.
