Introduction of Early Exit or Fall-back Qualifications for an Existing Undergraduate / Postgraduate Programme of Study

Your attention is invited to the Commission Circular No. 04/2021 of April 07, 2021, on the above matter.

- 2. The University Grants Commission at its 1103rd meeting held on June 08, 2023, drew its attention to the following
 - I. Introducing fallback options for state-funded degree programs for which students are selected by the UGC could encourage students to abandon their studies halfway.
 - II. As per the above circular on fallback options university students should be able to get fallback options only after the student has followed the degree program during the normal duration of the course and also the maximum period has been given for the students to complete the degree programs.
- 3. Accordingly, the following provisions are applicable in relation to early exit or fall-back qualifications:
 - 3.1 Both early exit and fall-back qualifications provide pathways for students registered for a programme of study leading to a particular qualification, to leave with a different qualification at a lower SLQF level. Such pathways must be designed so that the lower qualification to be awarded, the volume of work that must be completed for the award of this lower qualification, and the Level Descriptors are clearly specified as per the SLQF guidelines. Early exit and fall-back qualifications differ in that while students may choose to leave with early exit qualifications before completion of the maximum period of study required for the full qualification, fall-back qualifications are for students who have completed the maximum period of study that has been given for the students to complete the degree programs, but are unable to fulfill all the requirements for the award of that full qualification. Fall-back qualifications are meant to avoid the unfortunate situation where a student is compelled to leave a programme of study without any qualification despite spending the maximum period and some significant

- level of achievement. However, if a student is expelled from the university on disciplinary grounds, then such a student may not be eligible for the award of an early exit or fall-back qualification.
- 3.2 Early exit qualifications may be built into the design of new postgraduate programmes. E.g. a Level 10 MSc programme may have provision for exit with a Level 9 Masters, or a Level 8 Postgraduate Diploma. In designing such exit pathways, the expected programme outcomes or graduate competencies, the course structure, and the assessment strategy, including requirements for the award of each qualification must be clearly specified.
- 3.3 Early exit pathways may be also created within the structure of an <u>existing</u> <u>postgraduate programme</u>, but again, the expected programme outcomes or graduate competencies, the course structure, and assessment strategy, including requirements for the award of the qualification must be clearly specified.
- 3.4 The universities and higher educational institutes are permitted to award Fall-back qualifications below the SLQF Levels 5 on a case-by-case basis by the institution itself for the students registered for programmes of study leading to <u>Bachelor's degrees and Bachelor's Honours degrees</u>, but who do not fulfill all the requirements for the award of the degree. For such fall-back qualifications too, the expected programme outcomes or graduate competencies, the course structure, and the assessment strategy, including requirements for the award of each qualification, must be clearly specified.
- 3.5 Fall-back qualifications at SLQF Level 5 may be made available to students registered for programmes of study leading to <u>Bachelor's Honours degrees</u>, but who do not fulfill all the requirements for the award of the degree. For such fall-back qualifications too, the expected programme outcomes or graduate competencies, the course structure, and the assessment strategy, including requirements for the award of each qualification, must be clearly specified.
- 3.6 Early exit pathways are not permitted for undergraduate degree programmes to which students are admitted through the UGC.
- 3.7 A fall-back qualification may be awarded to an undergraduate student only after completion of the maximum period of study of the programme for which that student has been registered. However, students who are admitted through the UGC with possibility of following an SLQF Level 5 Bachelors degree or SLQF Level 6 Bachelors Honours degree and selected for SLQF Level 6 Bachelors Honours degree by the respective HEI may be allowed to request fall-back option to leave with the SLQF Level 5 Bachelors degree after completing all requirement for the SLQF Level 5 Bachelors degree as well as completing the minimum period of SLQF Level 5 Bachelors degree.
- 3.8 In a circumstance where a maximum period of study of the programme, for which the student has been registered, is unable to be met due to a barrier exam in which the student has utilized the full privilege of maximum attempts, then a fall-back qualification may be awarded provided that the student has to meet the expected programme outcomes or graduate competencies, the course structure, and the assessment strategy, including requirements for the award of a defined specified qualification which is below the registered SLQF level.
- 3.9 A recommendation for the award of a fall-back qualification to a student who applies for the award of such a qualification, should be made by the relevant Faculty Board, to

the Senate of the University, after an exit interview to judge the suitability of the student for the award of such qualification.

- 3.10 The effective date of award of an early exit or fall-back qualification should be the 1st day of the month after which the Senate of the University has approved the award of the qualification, at the request of the student, and on the recommendation of the relevant Faculty Board.
- 3.11 Provisions for early exit and fall-back qualifications should be included in the university by-laws for the existing programme of study.
- 3.12 All early exit and fall-back qualifications at the SLQF Level 5 or above should be approved by the Commission through the submission of an application to the OAC/relevant Standing Committees.
- 3.13 The application form to be used to obtain UGC approval for introduction of early exit or fall-back qualifications, for an existing degree programme previously approved by the UGC is shown in Annex 1 of this circular.
- 3.14 The effective date for the early exit or fall-back qualifications of a degree programme will be the date of the Commission approval received.
- 3.15 This Circular is effective from January 1, 2024, and the Commission Circular No. 04/2021 dated April 07, 2021 is hereby rescinded.

Please take necessary action accordingly.
