THE UNIVERSITIES ACT, No. 18 OF 1978 ORDINANCE made by the University Grants Commiseich under section 24 A read with Section 18 of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology Ordinance, No. 2 of 1985 and

- *Institute of Archaeology Ordinance, No. 2 of 1985 and shall come into force on 1st January, 1986.

 2. This Ordinance shall apply to the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology (hereinafter referred to as the "Institute") established on 1st January, 1986, by Order dated 18th December, 1985 made by the Minister in consultation with the University Grants Commission and a section 24 A of the Universities Act. No. 18 of und r section 24 A of the Universities Act, No. 16 of
- 3. The Institute shall be attached to the University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka (hereinafter referred to as the "University").
- 4. Subject to the provisions of the Act and of any appropriate Instrument and the powers, duties and functions of the Commission, the Institute shall have
 - (a) to provide for postgraduate instruction, professional training and research in archaeology;
 - '(b) to encourage and promote the acquisition, advancement and di sem nation of knowledge in the various branches of archaeology
 - (c) to sponsor, promote and stimulate the study and practical application of, and research in, archaeology :
 - (d) to admit and to organize and supervise the instruction and training of persons de iring to qualify for and obtain postgraduate degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions in archaeology;
 - (e) to conduct or to provide for the conduct of postgraduate examinat ons in archaeology for the award of po terriduate degrees and to recommend to the University person; who, having passed such examinations and having satisfied such other cond tions at the Board may impose, are eligible for the award of postgraduate degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions;

- (f) to promote fellowship among those engaged the study of and research in archaeology;
- (g) to collaborate, co-operate and co-ordinate with universities and other organizations in Sri Lanka or abroad for the interchange and di seminat.on of knowledge in archaeology;
- (h) to do all such other acts and things as may be nccessary and desirable for the promotion of the above objects and any other matters necessary to further the objects of the Insti-
- 5. The Authorities of the Institute shall be-
- (a) the Board of Management;
- (b) the Board or the Boards of Study; and
- (c) such other bodies as may be prescribed by Ordinance to be such Authorities.
- 6. The Board of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") shall be the academic and executive body of the Institute and shall consist of—
 - (1) The following ex officio members, namely-(a) the Director;
 - (b) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in-charg; of the subject of Higher Education or the nominee of such Secretary;
 - (c) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in-charge of the subject of Cultural Affairs or the nominee of such Secretary;
 - (d) two Vice-Chancel ors nominated by the Committee of V ce-Chancellor; and Directors established under Section 124 of the Act;
 - (e) the Head of the Department of Archacology of the University of Peradeniya;
 - (f) the Head of the Department of Archaeology of the University of Kelaniya.
 - (g) the Commissioner of Archaeology;
 - (h) the Director-General of the Central Cultural Fund; and
 - (i) the Director of National Museums.
 - (2) the following other members namely-(a) seven members appointed by the University Grants Commission from among perfors who have rendered distinguished service in educational, professional, educat'onal, professional, scientific or administrative spheres.

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- absence of the Chairman from any meeting of the Board the members present shall elect from among themselves any member to preside at such meeting.
- (2) The Chairman shall hold office for a period of one year reckoned from the date of his election and shall be eligible for re-election.
- (3) Any appointed member shall, unless he vacates office earlier, hold office for a term of three years reckoned from the date of his appointment and shall unless removed earlier, be eligible for re-appointment. ministration of the Institute.

Provided, however, that if any appointed member vacates his office prior to the expiry of his term, h.s. successor shall, unless he vacates office earlier, hold office for the unexpired term of office of his predecessor;

- (4) Any appointed member of the Board who with-out leave of absence fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Board, shall be de med to have vacated his office as a member of the Board, and the Commission shall appoint a fit person to fill the resulting. vacancy.
- (5) Any appointed member of the Board may resign his office by writing under his hand addressed to the Chairman of the Commission.
- (6) The quorum for a meeting of the Board shall be seven members.
- 8. The Board may, from time to time, appointed such number of Standing Committees and ad hoc Committees, consisting of such number of members and with such duties and functions as may be determined by the Board.
- 9. The Board shall have and may exercise, discharge and perform the following powers, duties and functions :--
 - (a) to hold, control and administer the property and funds of the Institute;
 - (b) to receive and accept with the concurrence of the Commission beque ts, donations and grants of property to the Institute;
 - (c) to consider the annual report and the annual statement of accounts of the Institute and to submit such report and such statement to the Commission;
 - (d) to prepare the financial estimates of the Institute and to submit such estimates to the Commission for approval;
 - (e) to provide or cause to be provided, the buildings, prem'ses, furniture, equipment and other materials needed for carrying on the work of the Institute;
 - (f) to recommend to the Council of the University in consultation with the Board or Boards of Study concerned, such persons as are suitable for recognition as examiners of the Institute;
 - (g) to draft, after consideration of reports from the Board or Boards of Study concerned Regulation; relating to courses or study and examinations, and to submit such drafts to the Senate of the University for enactment;
 - (h) to recommend to the University, in consultation with the Board or Boards of Study concerned the postgraduate degree; diplomas, certificates and oth r academic di tinctions which shall be and oth r academic di thetions which shall be awarded in the sev ral branches in Archaeology, and the courses of study and training to be followed the examinations to be passed and other conditions to be satisfied by students who wish to qualify for such degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions;

- (i) The Chairman of the Board shall be elected (i) to determine in consultation with the Senate of by the members thereof from among their number and the University the requirements for the admissible preside at all meetings of the Board, in the mon and registration of students to courses of the University the requirements for the admis-sion and registration of students to courses of study; and
 - (i) to do all such other acts and things, whether incidental to the powers aforesaid or not, as may be required in order to further the objects of the insuluce.
 - 10. The Institute shall be under, and subject to the control of a Director. Subject to such directions as may be given from time to time by the Board, the Director shall be responsible to the Board for the proper ad-
 - 11. The first Director of the Institute shall be appointed by the Commission. Every subjequent Director shall be appointed by the Commission from
 - a pand of three names roommended by the Poard.

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 Educational institution is appointed as Director, such Institution shall release such member of the staff so appointed, to accept such post of Director.
 - (2) The Director shall, unless he vacates office earlier or is removed from office as Director, hold office for a period of three years reckon d from the date of his appointment or until he completes his sixty-fifth year, which ver event occurs earlier.
 - (3) If a Director who was a member of the staff of a Higher Educational Institution prior to his appointment as Director, resigns or is removed from office, or completes his term of office, his shall unless reappointed, revert to his substantive post in such Higher Educational Institution, provided that he has not completed his sixty-fifth year.
 - (4) If the Director, by reason of leave, illness, absence from Sri Lanka, or other cause is temporarily unable to perform the duties of his office, the Commission shall, w thin seven day; of the occurrence of such inability or absence, make such arrangements as it may deem fit for carrying on the duties of the office.
 - (5) If any vacancy arises in the office of the Director, the Commission shall, within seven days of the occurrence of such vacancy, make such arrangements as it may deem fit for carrying on the duties of the office, unt l'a permanent appointment is made under paragraph 1L
 - 13. (1) The Director of the Institute shall be the principal executive officer and the principal academic officer of the Inst tute. He shall be an ex officio member of the Board and shall be entitled to convene, be precent and speak at any meeting of any other Authority or other body of the Institute.
 - (2) It shall be the duty of the Director, to ensure, in accordance with such directions as may from time to time be lawfully issued to him in that behalf by the Board that the provisions of this Ordinance and of any appropriate instrument in so far as they relate to the Institute are duly observed and he shall have and may exercise all such powers as he may deem necessary to
 - (3) The Director shall be the Accounting Officer of the Institute.
 - (4) The Director shall be responsible for the maintenance of discipline within the Institute.
 - 14. There shall be established a Board of Study in respect of each of the following branches of learning and for such other branch or branches of learning as may be approved by the Commission upon the recommendation of the Board :-
 - (a) Environmental Archaeology; and
 - (b) Social Archaeology

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- 15. (1) Each Board of Study shall consist of the following persons:
- (a) the Director; and
 - (b) such teachers and other persons, not exceeding five in number, appointed by the Board of Management from those imparting instruction in the Institute.
 - (2) The powers, duties and functions of each Board of Study shall be determined by the Board of Management.
 - 16. The financial year of the Institute shall be the same as the financial year of the University.
 - 17. (1) The Institute shall have a fund which shall be called the Postgraduate Institute for Archaeology Fund (hereinafter referred to as the "Fund").
 - (2) There shall be paid into the Fund-
 - (a) fees to be paid to the Institute in accordance with the provisions of any appropriate Instrument;
 - (b) income from endowments;
 - (c) moneys provided by Parliament and disbursed by the Commission as grants in
 aid of the Intitute; and
 - (d) all other moneys belonging to the Institute from whatever source derived.
 - 18. It shall be the duty of the Director-
 - (a) to keep or cause the keeping of the accounts of the Institute in such form and manner as may be prescribed by Rules;
 - .(b) to receive all moneys paid into the Fund and to credit such moneys to the proper heads of account;
 - (c) to make all authorized payments; and
 - (d) to prepare for the Board of Management such est mates as are required by the Commission and the annual financial appropriations of the ensuing year.

Provided, however, that income derived from grants made for specific purpoos or from endowments for specific subjects, shall be separately accounted for in the accounts of the Institute, and that no payment shall be made from such income for the general purpoes of the Institute or for any purpose or object other than for which such grants or endowments were respectively made.

19. (1) The Board shall prepare an annual statement of accounts and statistics relating to its activities in such form and manner and containing such particulars as the Commission may from time to time specify.

- (2) The books of accounts of the Institute shall be maintained at the office of the Institute.
- 20. The provisions of Part XIII of the Act relating to the auditing of the accounts of a Higher Educational Institution shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to and in relation to the auditing of the accounts of the Institute.
- 21. (1) The Staff of the Institute shall consist of such teachers, officers and other employees as the Board may with the approval of the Commission deem necessary for the efficient functioning of the Institute.
- (2) The staff of the Institute shall be provided on release by the University from among its own staff or be appointed by the Commission or the University, as the case may be. The provisions of Part X of the Act, relating to the appointment of staff of a Higher Educational Institution shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to and in relation to appointments to the staff of the Institute.
- (3) Where the services of a teacher, officer or other employes of a Higher Educational Institution have been provided to the Institute on a full-time basis, the Institute shall pay him the salary and allowances of his substantive post in the Higher Educational Institution. In any other case, the Institute may pay the teach r, officer or other employee concerned, such salary or allowances as it may determine with the approval of the Commission.
- (4) Subject to the provisions of the Act, the staff of the Institute shall be subject to the direction and disciplinary control of the Director.
- 22. If any question arises as to whether any person has been duly elect.d, appointed, nominated or co-opted, or as to whether any person is entitled to be a member of any Authority or other body of the Institute such question, shall be referred to the Commission, whose decision thereon shall be final.
- 23. No act, resolution or proceeding of any Authority or other body of the Institute, shall be invalidated merely by reason of the existence of any vacancy among its members, or any defect in the appointment of any of its members.
 - 24. In this Ordinance
 - "Act "means the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978 as amended by the Universities (Amendment) Act, No. 7 of 1985.
 - "Appropriate Instrument" means any Order, Ordinance, By-Law, Regulation or Rule made in accordance with provision of the Act;
 - "Commission" means the University Grants Commission established under the Act; and
 - "Higher Educational Institution" means a University, Campus, Open University, University
 College or Centre for Higher Learning established or deemed to be established under the Act.

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
